Currently working in the Construction Industry without a qualification or looking to work in the industry?

You may be eligible for the Certificate 3 Guarantee program if you:

- ✓ Permanently reside in Queensland, and
- ✓ Are over 15 years of age and no longer at school (excluding VET in schools) and
- ✓ are an Australian or New Zealand Citizen or Australian Permanent Resident (including humanitarian entrants), or a temporary resident with the necessary visa and on the pathway to permanent residency, and
- ✓ have NOT have completed a Certificate III or higher or be currently enrolled in a Cert III (excluding any qualifications completed at school)

The Certificate 3 Guarantee program provides eligible individuals with access to one subsidised training place in selected Certificate III qualifications. Once you complete your Certificate III qualification through this program you will be no longer eligible for further subsidised training under this program.

This qualification provides a trade outcome in construction of Steelfixing covering work in residential and commercial applications. Occupational titles may include: Steelfixer or Foreman.

The construction industry strongly affirms that training and assessment leading to recognition of skills must be undertaken in a real or very closely simulated workplace environment and this qualification requires all units of competency to be delivered in this context.

As construction is a high priority employment area, the training is heavily subsidised by the Queensland Government. There will be a co-contribution fee of \$200- (\$10 per unit) non-concession/ \$50(\$2.50 per unit) with concession for eligible students. This fee covers the enrolment charges, services, materials and all other expenses associated in delivering the training and/or assessment services, and awarding the certificate to the participant.

Concession Eligibility

To be eligible for concession you need to meet the above eligibility criteria AND:

- hold a health care or concession card issued under Commonwealth law; OR
- have proof that you are a partner or dependant of a person who holds a health care or concession card and is named on that card; OR
- be of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander origin; OR
- have a disability; OR
- be an adult prisoner.

Packaging Rules

To achieve this qualification, the candidate must demonstrate competency in 17 units:

- 14 core units
- 3 elective units.



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Some units in this qualification may have prerequisite requirements, which must be met when packaging the qualification. Users are referred to the list of CPC08 units with prerequisite unit requirements available in this Training Package for this purpose.

How will the training be conducted?

We currently offer this qualification as a 24 month (2 year) course and through the RPL process. RPL assessment has a maximum duration of 3 months and via simple self-paced learning that the student can complete at their leisure.

Fees charges and refunds

Refunds will not be issued to students due to change of mind once the training/assessment process has commenced.

Commencement requirements (RPL)

Individuals undertaking RPL assessment will have 4 years experience as a minimum in the construction industry.

Pathways Information

This qualification is just one of the requirements for an individual to obtain a licence with their states regulatory body. Please consult with your local authority to ensure you are eligible and meet other criteria prior to commencing studies with Building Industry Training. After the completion of this qualification it is recommended that the student undertake BSBSMB401 – Establish legal and risk management requirements of small business (towards a QBCC Trade contractors licence) and/or CPC40110 Certificate IV in Building and Construction (Building).
